March 17th will mark triple digits for this grand old theatre. On St. Patrick's Day, 100 years ago, over 1200 people streamed into the Colonial Theatre. The theatre was packed to the brim, and still 1000 guest were turned away because the theatre was at max capacity. Everywoman was the silent movie showing that day. It was accompanied by vaudeville performances all the way from Chicago. After opening night, the Colonial followed a typical schedule of movies and vaudeville shows. Matinee tickets were 25 cents for adults and 10 cents for children. Evening tickets were 35 cents for adults and 10 cents for children.

Did you know? In 1926, the Colonial briefly closed for "extensive exterior remodeling and complete redecorating inside." Owner Alexander Besse felt the need for a new indirect lighting system, projection machine, carpeting, and drapes. Additionally, Besse expanded the stage, providing an extra 10 feet in depth and covering the orchestra pit in the process. The most significant aspect of the 1926 remodel was the creation of the interior foyer. The Pittsburg Daily Headlight reported, "The old lobby is being torn out completely and will be replaced with an extension of the theatre to the sidewalk with commodious foyer inside the building. A lounge for women is being installed. The ticket office will be at

the edge of the sidewalk and will be fronted with an attractive illuminated marguise [sic]."
